If you are self-directed with the ability to work effectively within a team environment, are compassionate, creative, and resourceful, please consider this opportunity. This position will include client support and public education in Guelph and across Wellington County.

Job Responsibilities:

- Deliver public education, training, and workshops on sexual, domestic, and gender-based violence, as well as human trafficking.
- Assist in developing curricula focused on preventing and responding to sexual assault, sexual exploitation, domestic violence, human trafficking, and other forms of gender-based violence.
- Serve as an advocate and resource for the agency on issues related to gender-based violence and prevention education, with a focus on Wellington County.
- Demonstrate a strong understanding of rural issues and barriers.
- Develop youth-focused educational resources in collaboration with the Public Educator.
- Work with the lead Public Educator to maintain a relevant online presence.
- Provide all services through an integrated anti-racist, feminist, and anti-oppression framework.
- Compile and analyze statistical reports related to education work conducted in Wellington County.

Required Qualifications:

- Degree or diploma in Social Services, Education, or a related field.
- Minimum of 2 years of experience delivering educational presentations and outreach to diverse communities.
- Skilled public speaker with experience providing education on gender-based violence.
- Specialized knowledge of trauma, mental health, and substance abuse.
- Strong administrative and organizational skills, with high attention to detail and computer proficiency.
- Experience with a wide range of social media platforms.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Advanced knowledge of current community resources.
